IRISH UP NIGHT MAIL.
KINGSTOWN to LONDON Time Bill.

This Time Bill will be filled up by the Officer in charge of the Mails on board the Packet, and by the Officer in charge of the Mails between Holyhead and London respectively. Two official Watches (one for the Sea and one for the Land Journey) will be supplied for the use of these Officers; and, in order to prevent as far as possible dispute as to Time, the Officer in charge of the Mails on board the Packet should, on arrival at Holyhead, compare his Watch with the Watch in the L. and H. T.F.O., and record below the exact difference at the moment of comparison; and the Officer in charge from Holyhead to London should, immediately upon the arrival of the Train at Euston Station, compare the Post-Office Watch with the Railway Guard's Watch and make a similar record.

THE ROGER HOSKING COLLECTION OF SEA POSTS & PAQUEBOTS OF THE WORLD.

I first met Roger Hosking in 1979 when he was an occasional lunch-time visitor to Angus Parker's office in New Bond Street, when I was the office junior, and Roger was a senior executive in the advertising department of Cadburys with special responsibility for their coffee brands. Roger clearly preferred our office "serve-yourself bread loaf" and Selfridges 'nibbles' to the Cadbury executive dining room... I rapidly discovered that this famous Postal Historian was one of the friendliest collectors in the hobby, and that he had a wickedly dry sense of humour. I can honestly only remember him smiling or laughing - and often pouring scorn upon any politician rash enough to hold different views about the future to Roger's own - and his good humour ensured that his marriage to Mollie lasted for more than 60 years. I was amused to learn recently that for several days in 1975, after Britain had voted in a referendum to join the E.E.C., he wore a black tie...

Roger was born in Rugby, but managed to escape in 1938, when he gained a scholarship to Eton College, after which he saw active service in Aden with the R.A.F. during World War II. After the war he moved on to Oxford where he graduated in P.P.&E. from Corpus Christi College. He then entered Cadbury's graduate training programme in marketing and never looked back. Later on, he became Chairman of the Incorporated Society of British Advertisers. For most of his life, Roger lived in Surrey; 15 years in Virginia Water and then several decades in Oxted. He stayed with Cadburys for the whole of his working life, retiring in 1986 when he turned down the offer of a move to the firm's new H.Q. in Switzerland. He then enjoyed almost 30 years of full-time collecting during his retirement, along with his other pursuits that included bridge, rose-growing, overseas travel, enjoying the company of his grandchildren, and being a generous and highly entertaining host.

The name Roger Hosking has been inextricably entwined with the subject of Paquebot mail since the appearance of the first edition of his book in 1977, but he was very much involved in collecting and studying these unusual marks - and the reasons for their appearance on covers - for some 25 years before that. In 1954, while still in his twenties, he joined the 'T.P.O. & Seapost Society', having started to collect this area of Postal History around 1950. By the time he was 45, he had assembled an exceptional and extensive collection of worldwide Paquebot covers. In April 1971, he started a hard-back ledger that he entitled "*Register of Postal History Material*" in which he listed every item that he had acquired up to that time; over the next 42 years he made regular (sometimes almost daily) additions to the book, always in his neat hand-writing, giving a very brief description, a date of acquisition, insurance value and a consecutive ledger number to each item that was of significant value (initially - in 1971 - £1 or over!). This well-worn volume has been a fascinating reference during the describing of the 1,000+ lots in this catalogue. The ledger numbers were not written on the covers themselves but on the pages on which every item was mounted. By the end of April 1971 he had already listed no less than 1,300 items, and the last item added - on 19th Nov. 2013 - was No.5514. This means that around a quarter of the items in this fabulous collection had already been acquired well over 40 years ago. Some of the earliest provenances have been included in descriptions where they were felt to be particularly significant.

As time went on, Roger found that he had almost 'completed' his collection of Paquebot marks, but he soon found other related areas to study, and many of his most recent acquisitions included little-known but fascinating and rare Ocean Letters, covers with "SEA POST" markings (especially of Japan and the U.S.), Scottish pleasure steamer cachets, or those with the "Shipping Postmaster" marks of South Africa, rather than those with the word "Paquebot". He was aware that many of the post-1945 covers were 'philatelic' in origin - indeed he 'created' many of them himself in the 1950s and 1960s - but he always tried to avoid philatelic covers where possible, and throughout the collection there is an exceptionally high proportion of non-philatelic covers. It should be remembered that an item may be unique on commercial mail while dozens of similar philatelic covers are available; in my opinion (and Roger's) commercial mail is always preferable, even where the condition of commercial mail is understandably much less 'pristine'.

My wife, Pat, thoroughly enjoyed her collaboration with Roger in 1999/2000, when Cavendish published the 3rd Edition of his "PAQUEBOT CANCELLATIONS OF THE WORLD"; he described her efforts in his Introduction to that book; "...Pat has remained superbly undaunted throughout". It took some persuading to get Roger to re-number the 3,500+ illustrations for that 3rd edition, but Pat exerted her charm to good effect. The 4th Edition appeared in 2010 under the auspices of the T.P.O. & Seapost Society and continued the same numbering system, with new discoveries cleverly interspersed. Roger had been Chairman of the T.P.O. & Seapost Society for 20 years until 2010, and then he became Honorary Life President. In the descriptions that follow, the majority of catalogue numbers (e.g. H438 or H2363) can readily be identified in both the 3rd and 4th editions of the book, with only new discoveries of 2000-2010 having numbers that are only to be found in the 4th edition. Roger's books are referred to as follows in our descriptions: **PCW** for "Paquebot Cancellations of the World" (2000 or 2010) or **SUSA** for "Seaposts of the U.S.A." (2008) - with the **HBA**, **HCZ** & **HPR** prefixes also referring to that work - with references to Roger's "An Introduction to Ocean Letters" (2002) or his "Ocean Letters - a Sequel" (2005) having his **HE** and **HM** prefixes.

Sorting and describing this huge collection - housed in more than 80 bulging volumes - has been a most enjoyable, but time-consuming, challenge, not least because Paquebot mail, by definition, usually involves two or three different countries' Post Offices for each cover. There may be the stamp of one country used on a ship of another country, landed (and Paquebot postmarked) at the port of any country around the world and then destined for another country; cross-referencing has been an intricate task, and I strongly recommend collectors to **check the Cross Reference Index for items that they may otherwise miss under their primary country headings**. Roger did not believe in competitive philately, but had he exhibited he would without doubt have been able to obtain Gold medals aplenty. He preferred research, publishing and giving Society displays.

So this auction includes material from almost every country in the world, mainly from the century from 1890 to 1990 (with the emphasis very much on pre-1945 material), and much of it carefully preserved in Roger's albums for anything up to 63 years! For those people who wondered where Roger's T.P.O. covers have gone, they are the one section of the collection that Roger decided to part with before his death; the Cavendish auction catalogues of October 1995 and December 1999 included his T.P.O. covers (all of G.B.) with firstly his England and Wales collections (83 lots) and then his Scottish collection (56 lots). Being a pioneer collector, he always maintained exceptionally high standards with regard to the condition of his covers and the quality of the strikes of their various postal markings. Just like his T.P.O. covers, which were rightly described as being of 'hand-picked' quality, Roger was able to turn down any Paquebot or Sea Post item that was not of the finest quality.

The lots that follow, therefore, are generally in excellent condition and mostly with the finest available strikes. After all, Roger was collecting covers of the entire world, and had 60+ years to search, so there was plenty of choice (at least during the early years). His friendship with my old boss, the legendary Postal History dealer, Angus Parker, was also helpful. In the 1950s and 1960s, Angus was almost the only man who took an interest in, or sought to maintain a stock of, 20th century covers. Roger seems to have had first offer of whatever Angus acquired (often from the latter's buying trips around the U.S.). It does, however, surprise me just how many fine Iceland covers found their way into Roger's collection, given Angus's dedication to his own collection of that country's maritime Postal History...

So this is a momentous occasion for all collectors of Maritime Mail; there are large numbers of truly "Unique" or "one of only two known" items described here, many being offered for the first time in several decades. I doubt if there has ever been an auction of such a comprehensive collection, and there may never be another of this kind. Roger could not bring himself to part with any of his Maritime treasures during his lifetime, but he was very keen that they would eventually become available to as wide an audience as possible. The structure of this catalogue generally follows Roger's PCW chapter headings but with additional special sections for his other studies, and some general worldwide sections at both the start and at the end.. Perhaps no one will get everything that they covet, but there is surely something here for everyone; I hope that this catalogue will prove to be a sufficiently detailed companion volume to his own publications, and one of which Roger himself would approve.
